Public transportation is at the intersection of these dynamics. With the right policies in place, here's how we can move Central Ohio into the future.



FUNDING

Pursue robust state programs and policies that foster improved mobility and transit-supportive development.



INNOVATION

Advance technology policies that enable COTA to more equitably support the mobility needs of the region's diverse and growing communities.



REGIONALISM

Advocate for state programs, policies, and funding that support projected growth in the region by fostering economic progress, efficient use of resources, and a shared prosperity for all.

FUNDING

PURSUE ROBUST STATE PROGRAMS AND POLICIES THAT FOSTER IMPROVED MOBILITY AND TRANSIT-SUPPORTIVE DEVELOPMENT.

- Maintain the sales and use tax base and structure and ensure any legislation exempting a good or service currently taxable, also provide a mechanism to ensure revenue neutrality for the transit authority.
- Support state tax and budget policies that balance the promotion of inclusive economic growth and equity, while also ensuring the ability to provide vital local government services.
- Pursue increased federal pass-through "flex" funds for transit and institution of a dedicated state source for transit funding.
- Advocate for funding and policies that support the study and deployment of rapid speed transportation, and hyperloop technology in Ohio.
- Seek funding for an advanced and more equitable, multimodal transportation system that improves interregional access to more effective and efficient public and private transportation choices to connect to regional markets.
- Advocate increasing transportation dollars returned to localities and Metropolitan Planning Organizations.

INNOVATION

ADVANCE TECHNOLOGY POLICIES THAT ENABLE COTA TO MORE EQUITABLY SUPPORT THE MOBILITY NEEDS OF THE REGION'S DIVERSE AND GROWING COMMUNITIES.

- Support efforts that leverage ODOT, DriveOhio, Smart Columbus, Smart Region Task Force, Transportation Research Center and the 33 Smart Mobility Corridor and advocate for regional policies that prepare Central Ohio communities for additional smart-infrastructure and innovative technology investment.
- Advocate for programs that enable local governments to integrate smart infrastructure upgrades into road and bridge repairs and improvements.
- Advocate for policies and funding for first mile/ last mile and on-demand service, including microtransit and paratransit services.

- Encourage the adoption of data governance policies at the state level that promote open data and standardization, while protecting the security of private, personal, and otherwise sensitive information.
- Pursue policies and funding that measurably improve transportation safety and equity and advance Vision Zero, Artificial Intelligence and predictive analytics efforts at the state level.
- Advocate for funding and grant programs to support alternative fuel buses and low-to-no emissions buses, such as compressed natural gas (CNG) and electric buses.

REGIONALISM

ADVOCATE FOR STATE PROGRAMS, POLICIES, AND FUNDING THAT SUPPORT PROJECTED GROWTH IN THE REGION BY FOSTERING ECONOMIC GROWTH, EFFICIENT USE OF RESOURCES, AND A SHARED PROSPERITY FOR ALL.

- Support economic development policies and incentives that encourage transit supportive infrastructure and building standards.
- Support the use of TID's, JEDD, TIF, CDA, CRA and other community mechanisms to support the funding and operation of public infrastructure.
- Tie mobility solutions policies to the Administration and the Ohio General Assembly priorities, including workforce development, aging in place, education and health care access.
- Advocate for tax benefits for employer mobility benefits and other workforce development programs that incentivize transit use.

- Collaborate with regional partners to enhance the national competitiveness of Central Ohio through multimodal transportation.
- Pursue policies and funding to improve quality of life through expanded transportation options connecting marginalized communities in rural, suburban, and urban areas.
- Advocate for policies and funding that support a broad spectrum of housing options within key transit corridors to meet the region's growing residential and workforce needs.
